Dear Tribal Leader:

On behalf of the Indian Health Service (IHS), I am initiating Tribal Consultation to seek your input regarding the allocation of \$210 million in additional funding to the IHS from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), Pub. L. No. 117-2, 135 Stat. 4 (March 11, 2021), \$3.5 billion appropriated to the IHS in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), Pub. L. No. 117-58 (November 15, 2021), and \$2.35 billion currently under consideration by Congress in the Build Back Better Act (BBBA), H.R. 5376, 117th Cong. (2021). These new funding sources are described below.

\$210 million for Public Health Workforce Activities from the ARPA

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services allocated \$210 million in additional ARPA resources for Public Health Workforce activities. The White House <u>announced</u> the allocation of these funds on November 10, 2021.

The \$210 million will support the following activities:

- \$92 million to provide nurses in Bureau of Indian Education schools;
- \$67 million to enhance public health capacity for the IHS and Tribal Nations;
- \$45 million for additional IHS loan repayment awards; and
- \$6 million for core surveillance and epidemiology work for American Indian and Alaska Native populations.

\$3.5 billion for Sanitation Facilities Construction in the IIJA

On November 15, 2021, President Biden signed the IIJA, which appropriates \$3.5 billion over five years for the IHS Sanitation Facilities Construction program. These funds are likely sufficient to address the current estimate for all known deficiencies.

\$2.35 billion in the BBBA

Congress is currently considering the BBBA, which includes \$2.35 billion in additional resources for a number of IHS programs. The bill currently includes the following:

- \$1 billion to address the 1993 Health Care Facilities Construction Priority List;
- \$945 million for Maintenance and Improvement projects;
- \$124 million for behavioral health services, including necessary facilities improvements;
- \$113 million for Facilities and Environmental Health Support activities;
- \$100 million for Urban Indian Organization construction;
- \$40 million for the Small Ambulatory Program; and
- \$25 million for Tribal Epidemiology Centers.
