# **UDS Summary Report - 2018**

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#### UDS Summary Report Final – Calendar Year 2018

The National Uniform Data System (UDS) reports provide a "snapshot" of program performance for the reporting calendar year. Data in the National UDS reports are a result of validated data at the individual Urban Indian Organization (UIO) sites.

Data includes basic demographic information on the populations served and types and quantities of services provided. The following Tables indicate key findings of the Calendar Year (CY) 2018 UDS for the entire UIO population served as well as for each of the four program types. In addition, key trends are addressed. Note: The UDS summaries report Universal data (all patients) and American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) patients only. Indian Health Service (IHS) funding is not used for non-AI/AN patients/services. An UIO may receive funding from sources other than IHS which support the non-AI/AN population as well as the AI/AN population.

The data from 40 of the 41 UIOs are included in the UDS Summary Report for CY 2018. The IHS Office of Urban Indian Health Programs funds four types of programs: Full Ambulatory, Limited Ambulatory, Outreach and Referral, and Residential Treatment Center.

- Full Ambulatory Care: Programs providing direct medical care to the population served for 40 or more hours per week.
- Limited Ambulatory Care: Programs providing direct medical care to the population served for less than 40 hours per week.
- Outreach and Referral: Programs providing case management of behavioral health counseling and education services, health promotion/ disease prevention education, and immunization counseling but not direct medical care services.
- Residential Treatment Center: Programs providing residential substance abuse treatment, recovery, and prevention services.

UIO scopes of work are based upon their service population, health status, and documented unmet needs of the Urban Indian community they serve. It should be noted that six UIOs that provide outpatient and residential substance abuse treatment were not previously included in the national reports, but are included in the CY2018 UDS report.
