PROSTATE CANCER SYMPTOMS

Men have different symptoms for prostate cancer, however most times men do not have symptoms at all.

If you have any of the following symptoms, visit a health care provider:

- Difficulty starting urination.
- Weak or interrupted flow of urine.
- Urinating often, especially at night.
- Trouble emptying the bladder completely.
- Pain or burning during urination.
- Blood in the urine or semen.
- Pain in the back, hips, or pelvis that doesn't go away.
- Painful ejaculation.

Prostate cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer death in men.
