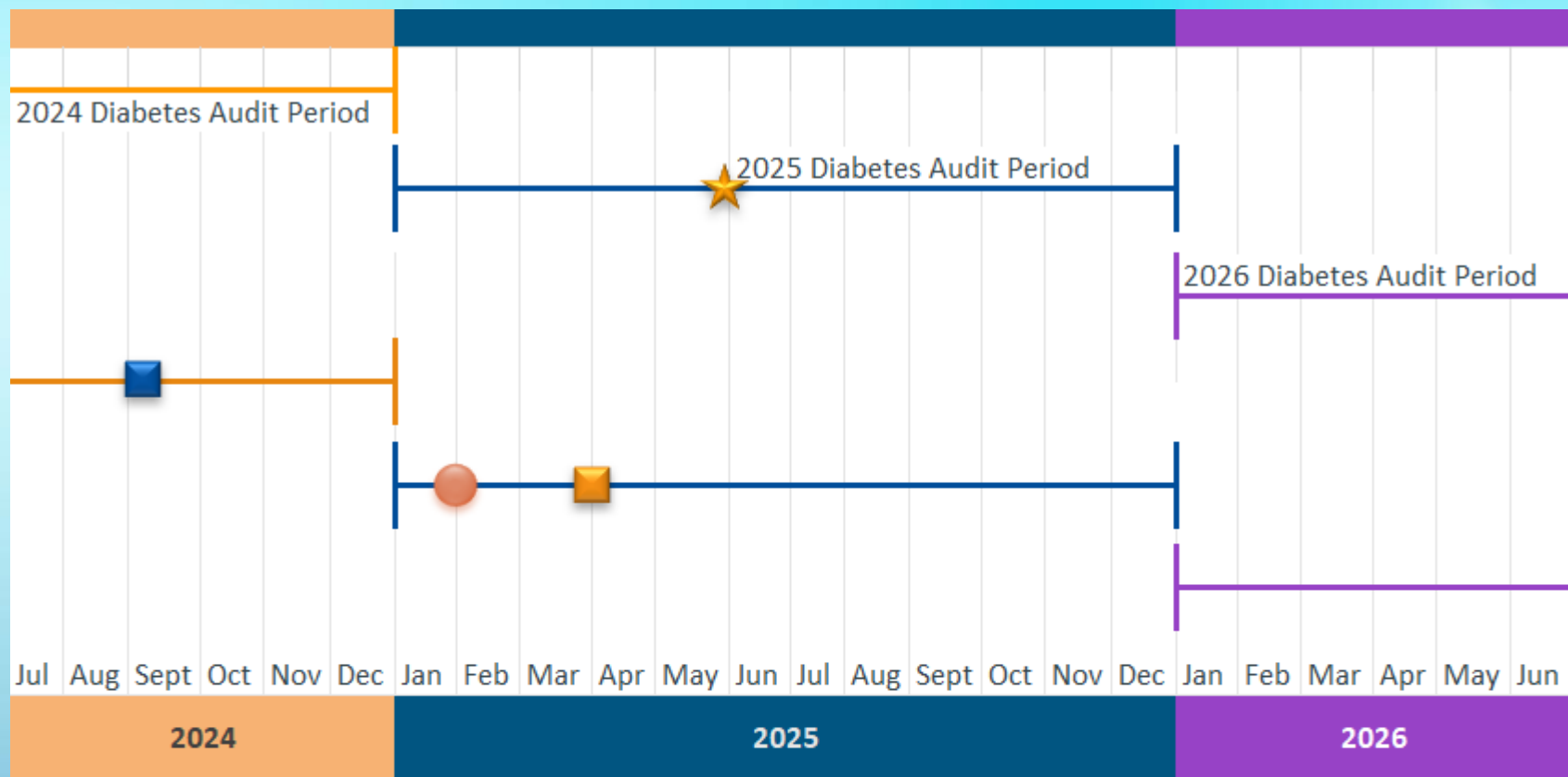

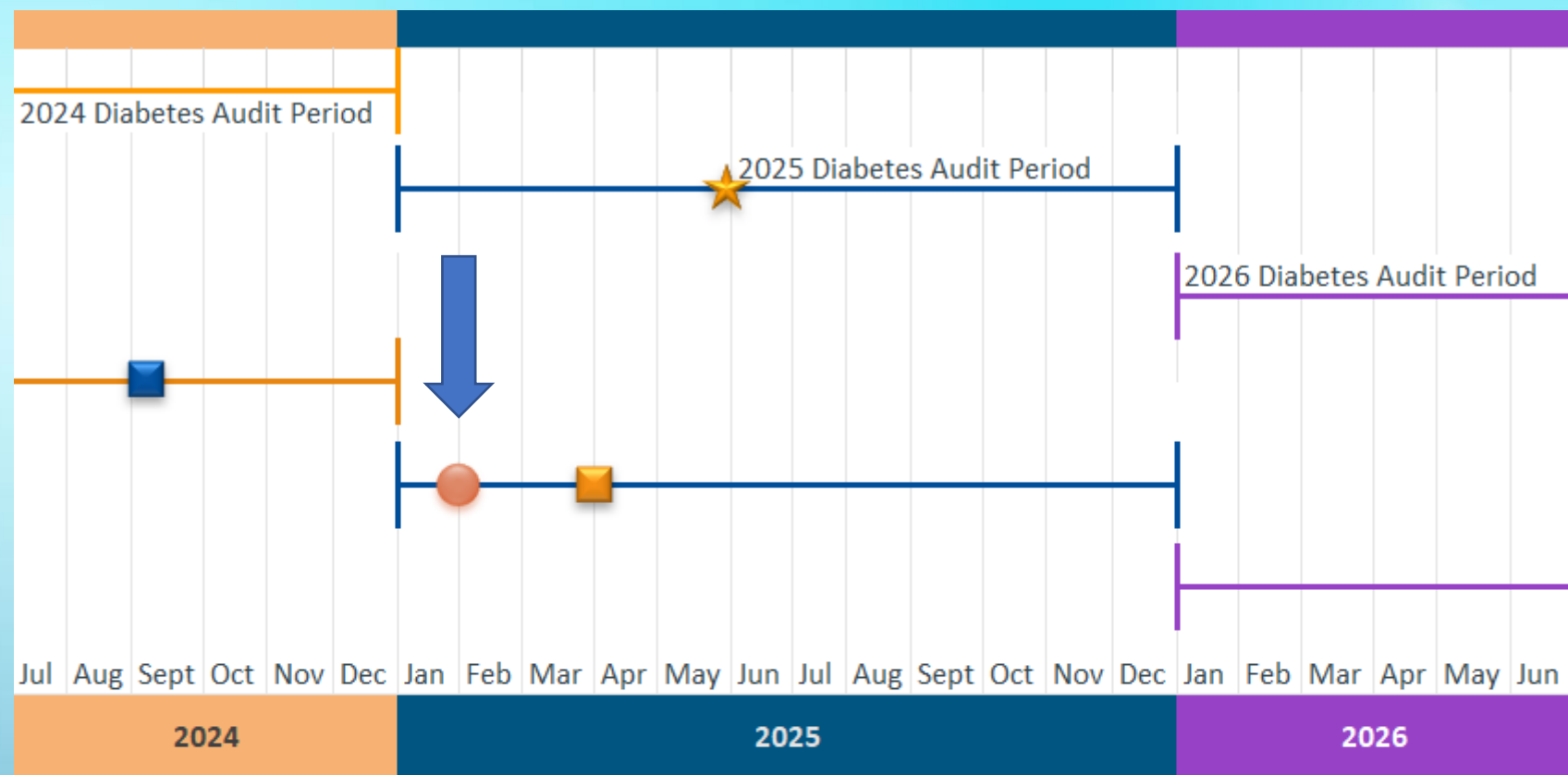

# Report: SOS Final Data

- **What?**
  - Best Practice Required Key Measure data captured at the end of the year to see if data improved.
    - Avoid aggregate for final data (or will need waiver).
    - Time of the year to “lock” your data.
- **Why?**
  - Data reporting requirement.
- **How?**
  - local records → SOS
  - OR
  - RPMS/EMR → WebAudit → SOS



# SOS Requirement

- The SOS is a web-based data system for SDPI programs to enter, check, and download RKM data for their Target Group for their selected [Diabetes Best Practice](#).
- This report must include the following:
  - Your program's selected Best Practice.
  - Target Group number.
  - Target Group description.
  - RKM baseline data for 2024.
  - RKM final data for 2024.





# Report: SOS Final Data (cont'd)

- **Where?**

- **Who?**

- **When?**
  - Annually, due by end of January of the next year.

# Report: Annual Progress Report

- **What?**
  - Report providing final updates summarizing your grant year.
  - Review of your program plan (project narrative) – have all activities/services been implemented and budget been spent?
  - Submission of final data for the year (from SOS).
- **Why?**
  - Reporting requirement by DGM and DDTP.
- **How?**
  - Submit report documents in GrantSolutions, in the **Performance Progress Report (PPR)**.
  - Ensure your local finance office submits Annual Federal Financial Report in Payment Management System.



# 2024 Annual Progress Report Template

The template is provided as an option for submitting the required information. Alternatively, all required information from the template can be provided on a separate document.

Tips for using template to prepare a successful (and complete) Annual Progress Report:

- Download (Save) a copy of the template to your computer.
- Ensure that all contributors are using Adobe Reader or Pro software to complete.
- Save the completed document – do not print and/or scan.
- Proofread to ensure all fields are completed and to minimize grammatical/spelling errors.



# Annual Progress Report Submission (PPR)


## Submission Steps:

1. Log into [GrantSolutions](#).
2. Look for your SDPI grant. Click on the arrow or grant number to access "Grant Details" screen.
3. Click on the Reports tab.
4. Use the *Report Type* drop-down to find and start your Annual PPR with 01/01/2024 – 12/31/2024 Reporting Period.
5. Click on the Start Report button.
6. Follow the guidance provided in the PPR to upload report requirements and submit the report.
7. Notify your [Area Diabetes Consultant](#) that the report has been submitted in GrantSolutions.

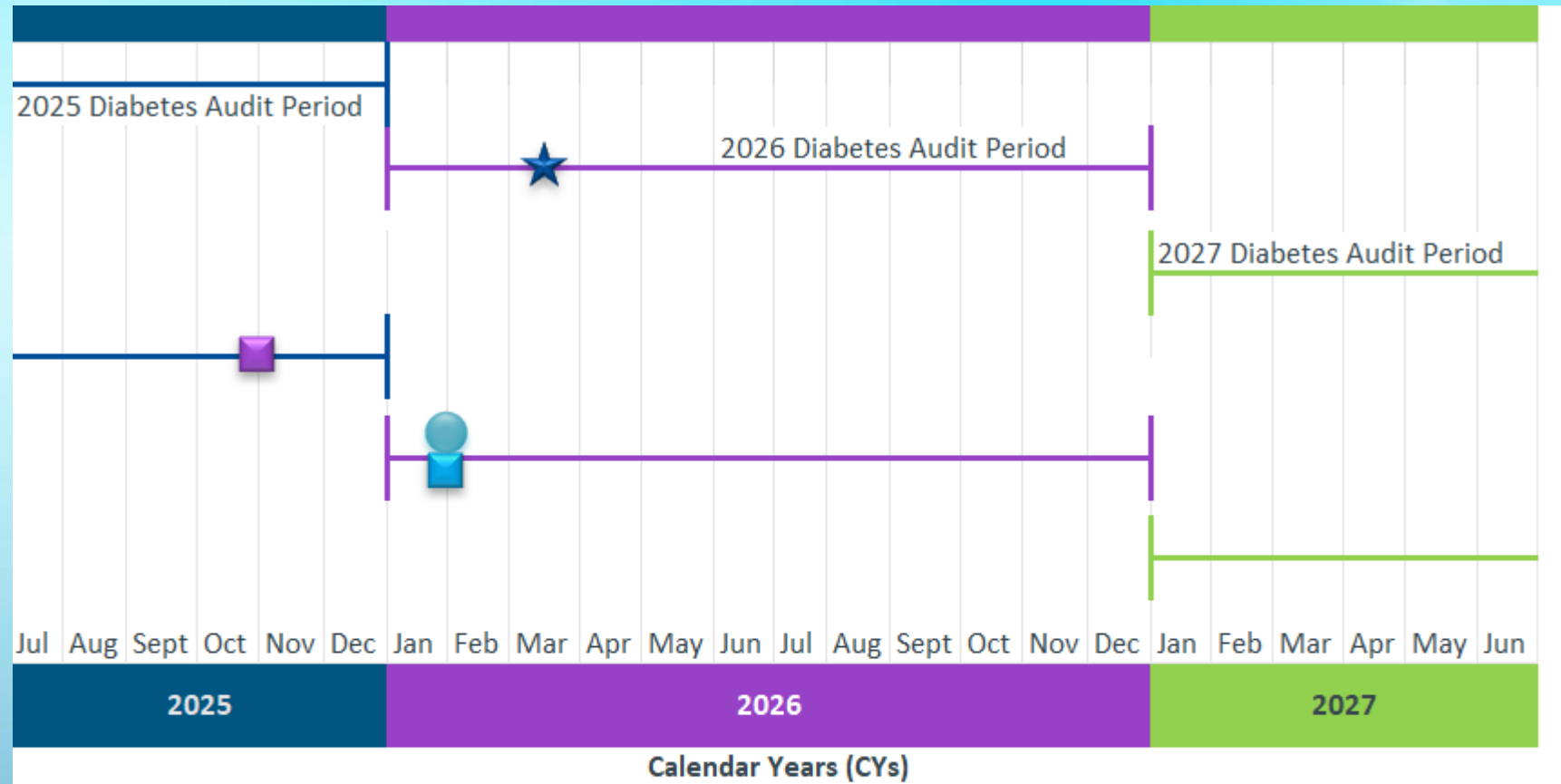

## TRACK YOUR STEPS

Follow in the Footsteps of Your Ancestors

Our ancestors led active, healthy lifestyles. Tracking steps makes it easy to monitor activity and know if targets are reached. Getting the recommended steps per day can help reduce blood sugar, blood pressure, and body fat.



### SET A DAILY STEP COUNT GOAL

Consider your age, health, and fitness level when setting a daily step goal. Consult your health care provider or fitness professional for guidance.

### USE A FITNESS TRACKER

- Use a smartphone, smartwatch, or pedometer to track your steps.
- Use the same fitness tracker to monitor and compare your step count.
- Fit smartphones firmly in your pocket for an accurate step count.
- Fit pedometers to your waistband or belt over the mid-line of either leg.



Cell phones and smartwatches automatically reset to zero overnight.

### HOW TO SET A STEP GOAL

Track your daily step count for several days before starting your program.

Is your step count below 3,000 per day?  
If yes, increase to 5,000 steps steadily over 2-3 weeks.

Next, build your step count to at least 8,000 steps per day.

Increase your steps for more health benefits. Getting to 10,000 steps most days of the week is optimal.

A good walking pace is at least 100 steps per minute.  
One mile is about 2,000 steps.
