4	 For individuals already entered in the SOS, update RKM Value, as needed. Click on "Submit RKM Data". Click on "Enter Individual". Ensure 2024 is selected as the year (click "Go" next to the year). Scroll down to "Edit Target Group Members RKM Data" section at the bottom of the page, click on the (+) sign to expand. Review and click on the Participant Identifier numbers to edit the RKM values for individual Target Group Members, as needed. For any new Target Group members, Enter Individual Information and RKM Value. Click on "Submit RKM Data". Click on "Enter Individual". Ensure 2024 is selected as the year(click "Go" next to the year). 	Local records SOS webpages ¹	
	 Scroll down to "Add a New Target Group Member" section and utilize drop-downs to enter individuals. Add Participant Identifier to your local records. 		
5	 Submit RKM Current Result. Click on "Submit RKM Data". Click on "Enter Individual". Ensure 2024 is selected as the year (click "Go" next to the year). Review "Submit RKM Current Result" section. If result matches your records, click on the "Submit RKM Results" button. If not, update individual information as needed or contact the SDPI Team at sdpi@ihs.gov. 	Local records SOS webpages ¹	
6	Lock your 2024 RKM data. Steps: - Click on "Lock SOS Data" in the left-hand menu Ensure 2024 is selected as the year then click "Go" next to the year Click the "Lock Data" button. 7	Download a copy of your Report for review/submission Steps: - Click on "SOS Grantee Reports" in the left-hand menu. - Ensure 2024 is selected as the year (click "Go" next to the year). - You can review the results on the webpage or download a copy by clicking on the "PDF Version" link on the upper right-hand corner of the "RKM Results Submitted for FY 2024" table. 8	Review your program's 2024 RKM Data Summary Report in the SOS. Questions: Does the exact same result appear more than once? If so, contact the SDPI Team to remove duplicates. Are the correct values marked as Baseline and Final? If not, contact the SDPI Team and tell them what to change. Is your baseline result 100% or close to that? If so, contact your ADC to discuss. What is the change from Baseline to Final? Is it consistent with your local data? If not, contact your Area Diabetes Consultant ² to discuss. Is the number of individuals entered much smaller than your Target Group Number? If so, determine if additional individuals need to be entered. Is the number of individuals entered much bigger than your Target Group Number? This is generally not a problem, but your Area Diabetes Consultant ² may contact you to discuss. Tips: If this report cannot be found or you have any other problems or questions, contact your Area Diabetes Consultant ² or the SDPI Team at sdpi@ihs.gov. Ensure that a copy of this report is submitted with your 2024 Annual Progress Report ⁴	SOS webpages ¹
